# Art Throughout The Decades

**Rend Lake Conference Center and Resort**

**Whittington, Illinois**

**MARCH 9, 2011**

**REGISTRATION:** Complete the enclosed forms and mail with check or money order payable to: Rembrandt Society, c/o Julia Crowe, 511 Oberle Road, Nokomis, Illinois 62075 by **February 17th.**

The \$55 fee per student includes meals (Friday's lunch and dinner), workshops, workshop supplies, awards, and space rental (lodging not included).

Chapters must pay \$30 per chaperone and others who will be eating with the group. For single adult members (art teachers that join as an individual member, not a chapter) the registration is \$30. One sponsor per chapter is free. I am waiving the security fee per room this year since we have been doing so well and the hotel does not require us to have one onsite.

**LODGING:** Make your own reservations directly with the Rend Lake Conference Center and Resort by calling 1(800) 633-3341. The cost is **\$72.15** a room (price shows tax). You will need to let them know that you are with Rembrandt Society when you book your room in order to get the special rate. The availability of this room rate is not guaranteed after **February 9th.**

Sponsors may choose the number of rooms that they wish, but A CHAPERONE MUST BE IN EVERY ROOM! Female and male sponsors may wish to share responsibilities. Phones in the rooms will be able to call only with the hotel. Emergency calls from family can be made to the numbers given above for the hotel. There is not a charge for hotel parking.

**TOURS:** Each group is responsible for making reservations and plans for their own tours on Saturday. We will not have any meetings on Saturday so groups can get up and getting going on whatever they choose. Local art site are Cedar Hurst Museum in Mt. Vernon and Southern Illinois Art and Artisan Center in Whittington.

**ARTWORK:** Each chapter will set up their own artwork during registration on Friday. This should be completed by 10:30 a.m., so please plan ahead as much as possible. Each group will receive one table per 10 students. You will not be about to tape items to the wall, so you may want to bring some type of display. Be creative in how you display your work. The table will be viewed from only one side. Students are allowed to enter three works of art in any of the categories of their choice. Please read over the art show rules.

**WORKSHOPS:** There will be two workshops for every student to attend. Students will not be required to submit to additional fee for supplies, but may be asked to bring some general supplies. Supply list if needed will be email to everyone closer to convention.

**STATE ART CONTEST:** Each student attending may enter 3 art works of their choice for regional ratings. All art works rated with a blue ribbon will also be judged in the state contest on Friday. Please make sure your work is labeled with the provided tags found in this registration packet.

**Would you like to sell your art?** This year two lucky students who are willing to sell their art will have that chance. A prospective buyer is looking to purchase two pieces of artwork whether or not they make it to state. He or She will be purchasing based off of what he or she would like to buy not necessarily what the judge would like to buy. He or She will make his or her announcement and pay for the artwork on Friday after the award ceremony. If you would like to sell your artwork please mark the appropriate box on the art show tag. The purchase price is a generous amount, so you may want to consider this option.

**SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITION:** Senior members may enter the scholarship competition worth up to \$800.

**OTHER COMPETITIONS:** Dressing up for dinner. Dress up as your group's decade for dinner. Prizes will be given out for best costumes in several categories.

### **SPECIAL PROJECT**

#### **DINNER WITH AN ARTIST!**

When you come to the Rembrandt Convention what decade of art are you going to showcase? What if the artist or artists you focus on will come to join you? The SPECIAL PROJECT CHALLENGE is to impress an artist or artists from your chosen decade with your specially designed table setting, decoration, or other artistic welcome to your table at the Convention. Prepare to set up your table at Convention...bring your work to be judged by Mother Rembrandt and her apprentices! Be proud, be creative, and be original! Bring your completed Special Project materials to Convention. Set up your assigned table to be judged. Your set up should be designed to reflect the decade you have chosen and to welcome an artist or artists of that period to your table. Maybe you would design your table decor, tableware, etc., to impress the artist; maybe you would show them why you chose them to be invited, or how they inspired you. Be creative... you'll show your talent.

**SPECIAL AWARDS:** Each chapter will have a member recognized for being the "Most Contributing Member". Recognitions will be given for years of attendance. Other awards will also be given.

**SCRAPBOOK COMPETITION:** Chapters may bring their club scrapbook to share and to be judged.

**CLUB PHOTOGRAPHS:** Each chapter will receive a free photograph of their club members. Additional photographs may be purchased for \$1 each.

**EVENING FUN ACTIVITIES:** After the award ceremony there will a DJ for a dance in the evening for all who would like to attend (staying the night or not). The dance will start at 8 p.m. and continue till 11 p.m.

**PIZZA:** The hotel is off the beating path so in the past, we have made one big order and Dominos delivered it around 10 p.m. So we will be doing this again this year. We will have a signup sheet at the registration table for you to place your orders according to school. All checks will need to be made out to Rembrandt Society. You will be able to pay cash too. We will have the cost for each type of pizza on the order sheet. All orders will need to be made by 3 p.m. with payment at that time. Announcements will be made to remind you.

## Art Contests:

Each Chapter will set up their own artwork during registration on Friday. This is to be completed by 10:30 a.m., so please plan ahead. A table will be provided as your display area. Art work can not be taped on the walls. The amount of space provided will depend on the number in your group and the area available. Be creative in how you display your work.

### ART EXHIBITION RULES

**Eligibility** – All Rembrandt Society members **in attendance** at the convention.

**Qualifications** – All work must be original. No copies, kits, paint by number, etc. will be permitted. Artwork should be matted or framed and have been completed since the previous convention.

**Number of Entries** – Students will be permitted to enter a total of 3 art works plus enter a special project.

**No fees** – In accordance with the Rembrandt Society philosophy of encouraging and supporting artists, the convention exhibit will be supported by all members through the convention registration fees.

**Labels** – Please print clearly and attach labels forms securely to the lower right front corner of the artwork.

**Delivery and pick up** – Each chapter will set up their artwork upon arrival at the convention in the area assigned to their chapter and must pick up artwork at the designated time.

**List of entries** – Sponsors will submit an inventory list form (see page 15) to the judges. The forms will be filled in with the judges' decisions. Colored dots indicating ratings will be attached to the artworks.

**Ribbons** – Ribbons will be given to the sponsors for distribution to their students.

### REGIONAL EXHIBIT

In the Regional Exhibit each chapter's artwork is set up separately. In this preliminary judging, every artwork receives a rating of first, second, or third. They are judged on their own merit. There may be many first, second and third ratings. All artwork receiving a first rating (blue ribbon) will advance to the State Contest.

### STATE CONTEST EXHIBIT

In the State Contest, three places are awarded in each category, plus five Best-Awards: Best of Show, Best of Junior High, Best of HS Graphics, Best of HS Painting, and Best of HS Crafts. All artwork in the State Contest that do not receive one of these ribbons, receives an Outstanding Artist Ribbon.

Best of Graphic includes drawing, printmaking, graphic design, digital art, and photography.

Best of Painting includes acrylic/oils, and watercolor/tempera.

Best of Crafts include ceramics, fibers, sculpture, and miscellaneous.

### CONTEST PHILOSOPHY

- To allow all members the opportunity to display their work. However, entry into the art show is optional.
- To allow art students to view artwork of their peers from other schools.
- To give encouragement to all art students.
- To give recognition for outstanding ability.
- To encourage growth. Professional judging and critiquing provides insight to students about their art.

## Candidates for Office:

All members are eligible to run for the offices of President, Vice President, Secretary, and Public Relations. Persons interested in running for an office should submit a candidacy form to be sent with the registration materials. Campaigning at the convention is encouraged. Candidates will be expected to give a three-minute speech on their qualifications and goals during the first general session and participate in the induction ceremony if elected. The officers will be chosen by a vote of the chapter representatives, one from each chapter present at the convention. Advisors should review the speeches before they are given. It is a requirement that the president's sponsor become the Convention Director for next year.

## STUDENT OFFICER JOB DESCRIPTIONS

1. Attend council meetings.
2. Select a convention theme.
3. Plan convention activities.
4. Conduct an installation service.
5. Serve at the registration table.
6. Design and mail a convention poster in September.

  - c. Introduce new officer candidates
  - d. Provide information on running for an office



### VICE-PRESIDENT:

1. Submit articles for all newsletters such as:

2. Send letters to chapters encouraging students to run for office.
3. Fill in for absent officers.

### SECRETARY:

1. Submit an article for each newsletter such as:

  - c. Any helpful or interesting item

2. Write minutes at the council meetings and mail those in attendance
3. Send pertinent information from the minutes to the newsletter.

### PUBLIC RELATIONS:

1. Submit articles to all newsletters such as:

  - c. How to keep a good scrapbook as a record of activities
  - d. Any helpful or interesting item.
2. Write to chapters encouraging them to get new chapters.
  3. Acquire names of prospective chapters and send a personal letter to them.

### **COSTUME DRESS FOR DINNER:**

Please bring something to wear for your school’s decade. Costumes will be judged.

Enjoy an evening of dancing to a D.J., playing games (provided by you), and relaxing with old and new friends.

### **FORMS:**

### **LODGING:**

The convention will be located at Rend Lake Resort and Conference Center. Make your reservations by **February 9th**. The cost of rooms will be **\$72.15** per room (tax already included). See page 2 for more information.

## **RULES:**

Students must:

1. Participate in planned activities at all times.
2. Listen to necessary procedures and follow instructions.
3. Remain in the convention area.
4. Have a sponsor or chaperone in or near each motel room at all times.
5. Have a sponsor or chaperone to keep the room keys at all times.
7. Be in their rooms and quiet after midnight.
8. Adhere to sponsor's rules in the room after midnight.
9. Wear name tags at all times.
10. Exhibit good behavior that allows everyone to have a fun experience at convention.

**Consequences for poor conduct unbecoming to the respectability of Rembrandt Society , such as leaving the group without permission, smoking, drinking of alcoholic beverages, illegal drug use, continuous disruption, destruction of property, etc., will result in removal of the student from the convention.**

## **SCHOLARSHIP:**

The Jim Hill Scholarship is given in remembrance of a former art teacher at Roxanna High School who was a driving force for the establishment of the Rembrandt Society.

- The scholarship form (pp. 17-18) must be typed and mailed in to Julia Crowe by Feb. 17th.
- Artwork must be matted in black or white.
- Artwork must be in a Presentation Portfolio.
- An index page with all work listed in order must be included. Index of work should include: Title of Work, The Medium, and Dimensions.
- Colored images of 3-D artworks should be in protective sheets and in a binder or your presentation case. Please have an index for the colored pictures also.
- A senior sketchbook is required. Sketchbook can be in a binder if needed.
- The student must be an active member of Rembrandt Society and have attended convention at least one time prior to this year.

## **SCRAPBOOK CONTEST:**

Bring your scrapbook depicting your group and their activities dating back to last year's convention. No covers over 2" in thickness, please. Scrapbooks should be a standard size, not being over 12" x 12". Each scrapbook will be judged 50% on activities of the group and 50% on artistic presentation.

**SPECIAL AWARDS:**

Recognition will be given for the most contributing member of each chapter. This student is always willing to lend a helping hand. He/She is a person that can be relied upon to work hard and see a job done no matter what the task. Attendance at convention is **not** a requirement for the award. Sponsors should include this student's name on the registration form.

Chapters may receive awards for traveling the furthest or for having the most students in attendance.

Sponsors with 10 or more years of attendance will be recognized.

**TEACHERS MEETING:**

Teachers will meet in the lobby area at 8:30 p.m. to evaluate this convention and to plan a future convention. Volunteers will be sought for job assignments. Please volunteer to do your share.

**TOURS:** Chapters may want to plan tours to art sites for Saturday. Suggested sites are: Cedar Hurst Museum in Mt. Vernon and Southern Illinois Art and Artisan Center in Whittington.

**TRANSPORTATION:**

Each chapter is to provide their own transportation to the convention.

**WORKSHOPS:**

Two workshops will be given with the presenter introducing the hand-on project to the entire group. More information will be available closer to convention.
